Eddie has provided transactional counsel and litigation representation to the Arizona State Land Department regarding sales, leases, land use, and water rights, including substantial representation on the novel issue of state title to the beds and banks of navigable streams.

Serving as General Counsel for the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, Eddie oversaw all legal support and was a member of the agency's executive leadership team, helping to manage all aspects of the agency and its \$250MM budget.

By working cooperatively and proactively with the regulated community, establishing agency performance metrics, and providing robust training, Eddie was able to increase compliance outcomes for the agency while also creating regulatory certainty for permittees.

Eddie helped draft and pass a state's new surface water protection program into law, providing greater stability for the regulated community amid the shifting scope of federal Clean Water Act jurisdiction. The program ultimately received support from homebuilders, ranchers, mining companies, municipalities, and the state's Department of Environmental Quality.

Eddie also served as executive sponsor and principal drafter of a state's Environmental Permitting Handbook and its separate Environmental Compliance Handbook, creating resources that promote efficient permitting and effective compliance for both regulators and the regulated community.

Eddie has served as a Big Brother Mentor with Big Brothers Big Sisters for more than 10 years. He has served as an Executive Council Member for the Environmental and Natural Resources Section of the Arizona State Bar Association and as an Arizona State Bar Educator for new attorneys.
