SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

Parenting Coordination - What is it and When Does it Work?

The New Parenting Coordination Rule went into effect 3/1/19 and approved Parenting Coordinators to have five hours training in the parenting coordination process, five hours training in domestic violence and mediation training. This session will discuss what issues they can address, what problems may arise and the prospect for providing help in difficult custody cases.

Mission Impossible

You are not the only advocates scratching your head about how to get money for your dependent spouse clients, avoid co-parenting disasters and keep the peace until the judge will hear about your client's emergencies. This program will focus on how to counsel clients and seek creative remedies from the court to avoid Armageddon.

New Support Rules-Changes in the Law

The support calculations have been revised because the Pennsylvania Supreme Court dramatically the Support Rules, as of January 1, 2019. Learn how and why spousal support formulas changed, with side-by-side comparison calculations to demonstrate the impact these changes will have on your clients.

Drafting Agreements in the Year 2019

With the law evolving, panelists address clauses not likely in your form support, custody and divorce settlement agreements. This panel focuses on new definitions of "family", legal dynamics, and responsibilities; changes in tax laws; and clauses for creative agreements that go beyond typical litigation results. Get ideas to avoid "unintended consequences".

A New Norm: Third Parties in Custody

This panel will explore the increasing prevalence of third parties, including grandparents (even great-grandparents), stepparents, same-sex parents/partners and persons standing in *loco parentis* in custody matters. The panel will address issues around third party participation in cases including standing, the use of preliminary objections, arguments for and against third party involvement and a discussion of recent and applicable appellate case law.

Mental Fitness: Impaired Professionals (Ethics)

Working with clients who have been exposed to trauma can create secondary traumatic stress experienced for family law attorneys and judges. What are the ethical implications? This program will help address this serious issue (with some levity), and provide thoughtful solutions for practitioners who want to remain healthy and effective, despite the stress.
